Introduction of Course

This course focuses on learning the most important digital technologies of today's apparel industry. The course combines 2D and 3D computer software such as Adobe Photoshop, Adobe Illustrator, and Browzwear VStitcher to develop a cohesive product line with specific parameters like target market and season. Lectures provide comprehensive walkthroughs of each computer software and teach advanced skillsets with digital software and product development. I learned how to develop original textile pattern designs using adobe photoshop and illustrator. I also learned how to use Browzwear VStitcher to translate my 2D designs into a 3D model simulation.

Favorite Part of the Course

The most exciting part of this course was learning Browzwear VStitcher. I was so excited I decided to invest in a proper desktop computer rather than remaining confined to the many laptop limitations. Buying a desktop computer has drastically improved my workflow in all of my courses, but especially when using demanding software like VStitcher in this course. I can now add more detail to my designs and render more realistic apparel in VStitcher. The computer has allowed me to elaborate more on my designs, which is another reason why I enjoyed this part of the course. Although this has been the most exciting part, it has also been the most daunting to learn as well. Just staying on top of all six of my courses with deadlines nearby has been challenging in itself.

Challenges of the Course

The challenges with this term's virtual instruction were limiting, but I did make some adjustments to my schedule to stay on top of all my assignments. At first, it was hard to remain focused on only virtual lectures, but without any other options, I had to adapt to it.
